TRAVEL REMINDERS

Traveling out of state to a county that is "Yellow" or "Red" means quarantining for 14 days.



Students and staff at public schools in Vermont must quarantine for 14 days after travel to any county outside of Vermont that is Yellow or Red on the cross state county map. Go to

https://accd.vermont.gov/covid-19/restart/cross-state-fravel to see the map, which is updated every Tuesday. Even a day trip to a Yellow or Red county is considered risky travel and requires quarantine upon return. (Travel to Yellow or Red counties that is considered essential-- medical care, child care, custodial parent visits, employment-is permitted). MORNING CHECK-IN ROUTINE CHANGES - IMPORTANT

INDOOR CHECK-IN: To prepare for colder weather, as of Monday, November 2nd, we will be conducting morning temperature checks and screening of all students *inside* the school building. We are determined to continue monitoring the health of our students at the start of the school day, and will move indoors to get more accurate temperatures.

Students in kindergarten and grades 1 + 2 will enter the building through the front door, and will be screened in the front hallway. Social distancing, and ample ventilation will be maintained.

Students in grades 3, 4, 5, 6 will use the outside entrance to the gymnasium, located on the side of the school near the playground. Students will be screened in the gymnasium. Social distancing and ample ventilation will be maintained.

BUSSES AND COLDER WEATHER: Windows will remain partially open on the buses on colder days, so make sure your students who ride the bus are dressed warmly! The buses will be heated, but not as warm because of fresh air ventilation.
